"REMEMBERING THE FALLEN"

Speaker: Maxine Snapka

Tuesday October 6, 2015 7PM at First Presbyterian Church



The plaque removed when Memorial Coliseum was demolished, and now displayed at Sherrill Park, contains the names of 393 Nueces County and Corpus Christi men and 2 woman who died in military service during World War II. Maxine Snapka will present a slide show highlighting the lives and service of some of the fallen servicemen and women. Maxine grew up in the same school classes with many of the service members and knew them personally.

According to a feature story in the Corpus Christi Caller Times last year: "Nueces County and Corpus Christi chapters of Gold Star Mothers began raising funds in October 1946 for a memorial plaque for the 393 men and two women from the area who died in service. When the Chamber of Commerce suggested dedicating the future municipal auditorium to wartime heroes, the mothers pushed for a promise from City Council that it would honor the fallen. The mothers and families of the dead held benefits, candy sales and other fundraisers, made public appeals for donations and dug repeatedly into their own purses to reach \$1,765 for the plaque.

When the Coliseum was torn down in 2010, the plaque was saved and temporarily displayed at Corpus Christi City Hall. Since then, a brick base was built at Sherrill Park where the plaque can be displayed upright, as it was when attached to the wall of the Coliseum. Sherrill Park is named for Warren Joseph Sherrill, a Corpus Christi sailor killed aboard the Battleship Arizona in the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941. His name is among those on the plaque.

The Nueces County Historical Society meets the first Tuesday of the months of September through April each year with a wide-range of programs and presentations focused on the rich local history of Nueces County and the surrounding area. Monthly presentations are held at 7:00 pm at the First Presbyterian Church, located at 430 S. Carancahua St. in Corpus Christi, adjacent to the YMCA. 
FREE NCHS MEMBERSHIP FOR THOSE WHO SERVED TO HELP KEEP U.S. FREE
