
NUECES COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY PRESENTS

Penny Pillack and Debbie Zuniga presented the program at the November meeting. Penny spoke on effects of agriculture during World War II while Debbie focused on the Blue Star Mother and Gold Star Mother programs.

The marker and log cabin are located in San Marcos. The house is the second house to be in San Marcos and it once belonged to a well-known Nueces County physician, Eli T. Merriman. He also lived in Banquete and Brownsville, as well as Corpus Christi. The hand-hewn house was built on Fort Street (now Hopkins) in 1846. He and his wife lived there with their six children. He was appointed postmaster of San Marcos in 1847 and also served as the county tax-assessorcollector. He is considered one of the city of San Marcos founders and in 1851, along with Gen. Edward Burleson and William Lindsey, laid out the town. He also served in the Texas Legislature. In 1852, he married his second wife and they had four sons. During the Civil War he was a commissioned officer and was a member of Captain Henry W. McCulloch's Company. He did much work for the Confederate Army. Two of his sons served in the Confederate Army while another served in the Union Army. Merriman died in Corpus Christi of yellow fever in 1867 and is buried in Old Bayview Cemetery. The Merriman Cabin was moved from its original located in 1960 and was made part of the Texana Village at Aquarena Springs. Texas State University gifted it to the Heritage Association who restored it and relocated it to Veramendi Plaza during the San Marcos Sesquicentennial Celebration in 2001.
