

William "Bill" Chriss is an attorney, historian, and a political scientist who has taught American history, Texas history, constitutional law, and political theory at Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi. He is the author of "Six Constitutions over Texas." He will share information about this book which examines how Anglo Texans went about creating their political identity over three quarters of a century and the impact of those decisions.



Local historian and author, Jim Moloney, was the speaker at the November meeting. He shared information about his latest book, "World's Greatest Football Team."
